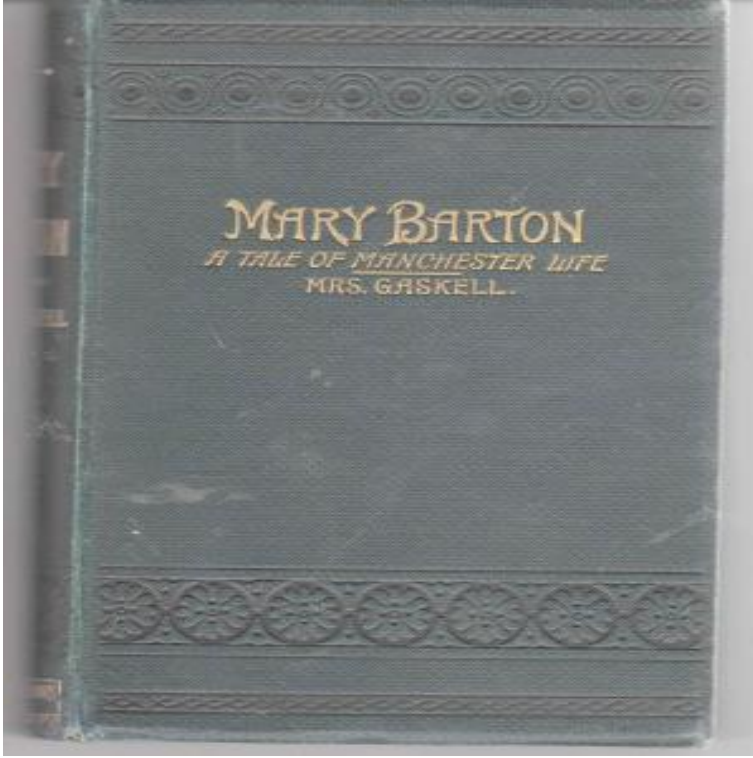


Mary Barton: A Tale Of Manchester Life
