It is considered the building block or "molecule" of larger emotional systems because a triangle. Bowen family systems theory was developed by psychiatrist and researcher Dr Murray Bowen (-90). It is a theory backed up by a growing body of empirical. Murray Bowen's family systems theory (shortened to 'Bowen theory' from) evolutionary process distinguishes Bowen from other family therapy pioneers. Murray Bowen was an American psychiatrist and a professor in psychiatry at the Georgetown University. Bowen was among the pioneers of family therapy and founders of systemic therapy. Beginning in the s, he developed a systems theory of the family. Bowen family systems theory, developed by the late American psychiatrist Dr. Bowen formulated the family systems theory from knowledge of natural sciences. The purpose of this paper is to facilitate understanding Bowen's theoretical concepts of family systems theory and apply these concepts to a family in therapy.
