### 1. INTRODUCTION

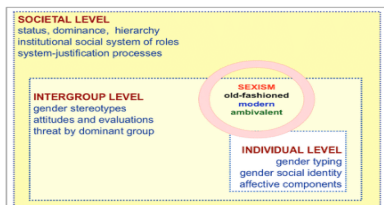
#### Social-psychological background of gender-related social relationships

Social systems based on hierarchy and organized by status differences are sharply exemplified in these social phenomena of gender roles. There is an abundant literature on the analysis of the assumed or identifiable inequalities of males and females along with the legitimization of the related ideologies. There are observed power and status differences in every society, therefore males and females are in different status in every society. (Ridgeway–Bourg, 2004). The discourse of social systems utilizes its peculiar *gender ideologies* to serve the perception and rationalization of inequalities between genders. The last decade of social psychology literature highlighted the gender-associated group-, or system-based theories, where gender relations have embedded into thought systems, for example theories that are interpreted from a dominance-related context. Social dominance (Sidanius –Pratto, 2005), system-justification (Jost, 2003), status (Ridgeway–Bourg, 2004), and social role theory (Eagly, 1987) are the most important theoretical approaches.

The *perspectivist-conceptualist approach* (McGuire 2001) integrates the examined phenomena in a complex and multilevel framework (Jost, 2003; Hunyady, 2003).

Due to this approach, lower levels of social phenomena become more interpretable through the examination of societal level structures positioned above the individual and group levels. (Jost, 2003).

Setting the conceptual framework, approached from the societal level of the explanatory theories, the individual representation level of the analysis was reached through group-related representation and relation levels.

The societal level is characterized by mechanisms, such as employment segregation, gender-related representations of the media, *ideologies* of inequalities perceived in economic and political spheres
